TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. To review faculty monitoring reports and to evaluate impact on Teaching and Learning standards across the school.
2. To advise the Governing Body on the school's curriculum statement and their statutory obligations regarding the National Curriculum and its assessment procedures.
3. To provide information about how the curriculum is taught, structured, evaluated and resourced through staff accountability and regular curriculum/pastoral staff presentations at meetings.
4. Report to the termly meeting of the Governing Body progress in implementing the self-review policy.
5. To review the school academic performance and the information published regarding this.
6. To prepare information concerning raising standards and make available to parents annually via usual forms of school communication.
7. To review the policy and provision for collective worship and for Religious Education and its impact.
8. To review the safeguarding procedures across the school, including the Child Protection Policy, annually and receive reports as appropriate. To check regularly that the single central record is up-to-date. This to be a standard agenda item
9. To review the policy and provision for sex education and its impact.
10. To contribute to the preparation of a whole school drug policy.
11. To ensure that the requirements of vulnerable groups of children, for example, pupil premium, catch up premium, special educational needs (SEN) are met and monitored to ensure inclusion throughout the school and that these students make good progress.
12. To review and make recommendations concerning the general principles of school discipline, welfare, well-being, behaviour and safety and the impact they have on students' progress overall.
13. To review impartial information, advice and guidance (IIAG) and the impact it has on ensuring students are informed and guided effectively regarding transition choices.
14. Regular monitoring of school performance relating to behaviour and attendance to assess the impact strategies are having on improving behaviour and attendance to support student progress.
15. To look at policies and assess the impact they have made.
16. To review other policies as devolved to the Committee by the Governing Body.

17. To make decisions within the Committee's remit when given the mandate by the Governing Body.
