Dear Parents/Carers

Uniform at Culcheth High School

As we have started a new year, I would like to take this opportunity reiterate the school's uniform rules for skirts, make-up, jewellery and nail varnish.

It is evident that a number of students have returned after the Christmas break and are not adhering to the specific school uniform rules regarding skirts, make-up, jewellery and nail varnish.

The specific issues are:

- School skirts being too short due to them being rolled up at the waist or wearing a smaller size skirt than is appropriate
- Excessive make up, particularly eye make-up, false eye lashes and heavy eye brow make up
- Rings, bracelets and inappropriate ear rings being worn
- Some students wearing nail varnish or various types of false nails following a weekend

The School Uniform Statement (excerpt below) sets out the expectations at Culcheth High School:

- Black school skirt (with logo and worn to the knee)
- Jewellery must not be worn in school but students with pierced ears may wear one stud in each ear, in the lower lobe.
- Excessive make-up is unnecessary and inappropriate for school and must not be worn.
- Nail polish, acrylic/shellac/gel nails and nail extensions should not be worn for school.

I would be grateful for your support in ensuring that our students maintain the expected standards set out above and as from Monday 22nd January, any student not adhering to the expectations will be sanctioned and home contact will be made to discuss the issue moving forward.
